

SYRIA:

“One of the components of health is freedom from war which this population does not have.”

“SYRIA: largest refugee population”

“Reminded me of Nazi doctors using torture during the Holocaust”

“A friend was recently volunteering to provide services/activities to kids in refugee camps — here minded that the war has been going on so long that most 6 - 7 year olds cannot read — they were never able to go to school.”

SUDAN:

“The rape epidemic in Sudan resonates with me because rape is often not considered an act of modern warfare”

“Violence against women as a war tactic in Kashmir, Palestine”

“The Sudanese civil conflict centering Darfur was a “hot topic” when I was a senior in college. Upsettingly, the global eye seems to have moved on...”

“I moved from a city which a large Sudanese new American/refugee population and a study from our biggest hospital showed 100% of those seeking healthcare had a history of trauma.”

YEMEN:

“My work focuses on college students in the U.S. —> I wonder the impact on students who have family/friends/relatives/ living through war across the globe.”

PALESTINE:

“Israel is colonialism and imperialism. Free Palestine.”

“Water is a human right.”

“India and Pakistan control water access and use in Kashmir”

“Water is essential and a basic need of Life! What a crime to charge 6 times the amount AND have it contaminated! The rationing made me think of USA-Western water rationing on things like watering yards and filling pools. It’s disheartening to think of these “1st world problems.”
